

What Students Should and Should Not Bring to the Exam

What to Bring

- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers).
- Pens with black or dark blue ink.
- A watch that does not have Internet access, does not beep, and does not have an alarm. (Exam rooms will have visible clocks)
- Your school I.D.
- A sweater in case you feel cold while testing.
- Up to two approved calculators with the necessary capabilities if taking the AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics or Statistics Exams. Visit (apstudent.collegeboard.org/apcourse) to find the calculator policy for your subject and for a list of approved graphing calculators.
- A ruler or straightedge only if you are taking an AP Physics exam. Protractors are not allowed.
- A small snack and drink for the ten-minute break. Drinks must be stored in a spill-proof container or plastic bottle.
- A sack lunch if you are taking Spanish Language.

Additional Items to bring for Off Campus Testing only

- Your bus boarding pass.
- A backpack to carry your personal belongings. (You will not be permitted to access your backpack while testing is in progress.)

What Not to Bring

- Electronic equipment (iPad, cell phone, smartphone, laptop, tablet computer, etc.), portable listening or recording devices (MP3 player, IPOD, etc.), cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, and any other electronic or communication devices.
- Books, compasses, protractors, mechanical pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes or colored pencils.
- Scratch paper (notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets).
- Watches that beep or have an alarm, or smartwatches.
- Reference guides, keyboard maps or other typing instructions.
- Computers
- Ear plugs.
- Clothing with subject-related information
